The sample of participants consisted of 20 students of BS English, from Superior University Lahore and University of Lahore. Sample of 20 BS English students of Private Universities took part in the current study. In this study, mixed techniques were used to look into the speaking issues that undergraduate students experience. The findings indicate that English majors at public and private universities have many difficulties communicating in English. However, this study indicated that students at public universities have slightly better English proficiency and experience fewer obstacles.




Fig 1 Logical Development of Students' Speaking Skills



according to their opinion about the statement. The graph indicates that 7 participants out of 20, responded agree and 13 participants responded strongly agree on the statement, which shows that







society that students know that they have lack of confidence but cannot find any proper way of rid out from lack of confidence.























This shows a solution of learning fluently English in our universities that students know that they have these kind of easy way to overlap that kind of problems.

Graph 4.19 shows the answers of students on the statement 4.19 that is "Translate dialogue of native language in English with the help of different mobile apps are very supporting while they are trying to learn English language".20 students responded according to their opinion about the statement. The graph indicates that 5 participants out of 20, responded agree and 14 participants responded strongly agree and 1 participant responded disagree on the statement,

which reflects that students are of the view that this way is very supporting while students try to learning English language. This reflects easy way to learn English language in short time.

Graph 4.20 shows the answers of students on the statement 20 that is "Try to improve the English listening skills are very useful while they are trying to learn English language".20 students responded according to their opinion about the statement. The graph indicates that 13 participants out of 20, responded agree and 6 participants responded strongly agree and 1 participant responded disagree on the statement, which reflects that students are of the view that this way is very helpful while students try to learning English language. This reflects easy way to learn English language in short time.

Findings of Study

The qualitative part of this study is perceptions of students about the difficulties of learning English.

To get feedback of students, researcher conducted focus group interview. The themes from the interview were emerged. Following are the themes emerged from the focus group interview.

Basic Education System The main theme of this focus group interview is that schools and colleges system are not suitable for learning English language so that is way "we are still facing the problem in learning English even we are the students of universities.

Usage of Urdu language during the class

Students answered on this question "Teachers are deliver the lectures in Urdu language during the class" yes, the teachers are delivering the lectures in Urdu language for better understanding because we are unable to understand the lectures in English.

Discussions and Interpretations

In this section, the discussion is presented by elaborating the result of stud ents' responses on Questionnaire and focus group Interview about problems and solution of learning speaking

English. The current study's findings provided several insights into what successful language learners did to achieve a high level of English proficiency. This discussion is divided into two major parts: 1) Student's problems about English language learning, 2) Student's language learning strategies or solution.

Student's problems about English language learning

First of all we discuss some problems/questions which faced by students during learning English, and asked from the university students with the help of questionnaire and focus group interview.

The first question of this research is about making common grammar mistakes when students try to speaking in English. This question is answered based on the students' responses while attempting to speak in English. As discussed in the literature review, university students are primarily affected by this issue. The study's overall findings pointed to a problem in language learning. Language learning becomes difficult for students, especially when the language is not their first language.

From the response of mostly students clear that thing they have no proper way to generate the sentences during communication in English language.

The second question of this research is about shyness of university students while they are trying to speak in English. Mostly students agree on this statement "yes we feel shyness while we want to talk in English language because we have no great command on this language if we make some mistakes people will laugh on us".

It means that they have lack of knowledge or lack of practice about spoken English. The third question of this research is about "problems in pronounce the English words during communication", majority of the students are agree on this "yes we are unable to pronounce many words because these words are very difficult and unseen so that is why when we read some books or newspaper in English we don't pronounce many words properly or correctly.

This statement explores the lack of reading skills of students because they have no routine of reading books in English. The other question of this research is very important and 90% students facing this problem while they answered in focus group interview, "Basic education is system is not supporting in learning English language".

It means that the Pakistan's schools and colleges system not providing the proper way or environment to learn English language, mostly villager students facing this problem.

Student's language learning strategies or solutions.

In this part we discuss about the Student's language learning strategies or solutions which answered by the students on questionnaire and focus group interview.

First solution of this research is "Watching English movies and listening English songs with English subtitles".

This solution is very useful for learning English language in short time because in the movies and songs writers used the dialogue which is commonly pronounce in daily life. So with the help of this statement students can overlap the problems which brings the hindrance in learning language.

The second solution of this research is "Reading English novels on daily bases".

The students give the positive response on this statement they totally agree on this thing if anyone can read the novels on daily bases then automatically his/her English language will be improving.

The other solution of this work is "Uses of different type of dictionaries for understanding the meaning of difficult English words".

It means that if students install the dictionaries in their mobile phone and used these dictionaries on daily bases they can increase English vocabulary. And find out the synonyms of difficult words which can solve the problem of pronouncing the difficult words.

And other solution of this research is "Chat with friends in English language". This is also suitable way to improve the spoken

English if the students chat with each on what's app and other social apps they can easily rid out from the problems of learning English language.

Note:

If the universities students follow these some ways which are given below in appendix 4.1 they can easily rid out from the hindrance which they are facing during learning English Language.

Conclusion

The purpose of the current study was to look into successful language learners' use of English language learning tactics. **Oualitatively** Information gathered from focus groups were done by seven graduate students from the University of Lahore and Superior University Lahore. The participants disclosed that they often increased their exposure to English input and managed their learning using a variety of tactics. The need of paying great attention to formal elements and expressions in language input and making an effort to embody them is another topic raised by participants. They favored reading aloud as a particular method of learning in order to become more fluent, gain a sense of the language, and pick up useful expressions. Although they agreed that reading and other forms of passive exposure to English are valuable, they contended that active exposure to minimize hurdles in learning English. This study accomplished on the following parameters,

- To introduce easy ways for students to learn English vocabulary.
- To highlight the hindrance of university students in learning Language.
- To point out the solutions of the problems while student trying to learn

English Language.

Recommendations

Because the preliminary study demonstrates the practical ways of the vocabulary builder applications and solve the many other problems like shyness, lack of confidence and difficulty in pronouncing some English words for students, its feasibility for learning vocabulary, and the importance of learning English language as a second language learning, vocabulary learning should be included as a part of learning from an early level of education, such as the intermediate level. The teacher should focus not only on the grammar of the language but also on vocabulary learning. As students are increasingly engaged with technology, institutes should focus on vocabulary English learning through applications, which can be installed in computer lab computers because at the intermediate level, not all students have mobile phones, so they can learn vocabulary in the computer lab. But when they join university level, they can install the different kind of dictionaries and other English learning mobile apps.

With the help of these kind of steps students can easily learn English Language.

Future Research

This research opened new methods for other researchers to introduce new ways for English's learning language. Future research should focus on other interesting ways of improving learning through which students may not consider learning language a boring and difficult task. Future researches should also focus on the delimitations of this research and work further by setting aside those delimitations of the study, that are as below:

- The study just focused on selective students of private Universities Lahore, Pakistan.
- This study is only concerned with BS English students; further research can be done for MPHIL or PHD students.
